### **ITINERARY:**

#### **Entebbe – Day 1**

Early morning arrival by flight at Entebbe International Airport.

Met by our representative outside the customs and immigration hall.

Transfer to the hotel for check-in.

Transfer by your guide to take your boat to mabamba swamp in search of the shoebill. The boat trip through the lagoon is usually very rewarding for all of its birds.

Later, drive back to the hotel. Overnight on Bed and Breakfast basis at the **Boma Hotel Entebbe.**

Situated on a peninsula in Lake Victoria, the former seat of Uganda's government, Entebbe is just a short drive from the current capital and offers plenty to keep visitors amused. This charming town features tree-lined streets and serves as an excellent base from which to explore the surrounding area. Tourists can look forward to spending days on beautiful beaches along the banks of Lake Victoria, stroll through the fields and forests of the magnificent Botanical Gardens, or pay a visit to Ngamba Island Chimpanzee Sanctuary, a haven for country's orphaned chimps.

#### **Entebbe – Day 2**

Breakfast at the hotel and check out.

**09h00:** Take a boat cruise out on Lake Victoria to Ngamba Island Chimpanzee Sanctuary and have a chance to view chimpanzees feeding. You will also be treated to sights of monitor lizards, birds, and photographic opportunities. Upon arrival at the sanctuary, you will be directed to the visitor's center where you will be introduced to the project, its history, residents and their plight. You will receive a

personal orientation by a chimpanzee caregiver and view feeding of the chimpanzees from the visitors' raised platform area along the edge of the sanctuary fence.

Once through, have a boat ride back to shore. Rejoin your driver-guide and then proceed to the Entebbe Zoo. If time permits, visit a local market and return to the hotel for the evening.

Overnight stay at the **Boma Hotel Entebbe** on Bed and breakfast basis.

### **Kampala – Day 3**

Breakfast at the hotel and proceed on a city tour of Kampala;

Some of the things you will see on a walking tour around Kampala city include the old taxi park, Owino market, local crafts, vegetable and food markets, the Kabaka's palace, the Idi Amin torture chambers, the Kasubi tombs, the Kabaka's lake (It is a man-made lake by the Kabaka himself), the Hindu temple, Bahai temple, the Gaddafi mosque, Uganda Martyrs shrine, the Catholic and Anglican churches on different hills, the independence monument and so many other landmarks.

Lunch will be at a select restaurant (payable directly)

Return to the hotel at leisure.

Overnight stay on Bed and breakfast basis at the **Golden Tulip Hotel Kampala**.

Bordering the magnificent Lake Victoria, Uganda's capital city - Kampala - sprawl out over a series of undulating hills and despite the development, this 'Garden City' is known for its tree-lined avenues. This bustling city serves as the commercial hub of the country boasting a blend of African markets, modern skyscrapers, international hotels, bars, and casinos. It provides an excellent base from which to explore the surrounding area. Visitors can look forward to learning about the country's rich and colorful history at the Uganda Museum; enjoying a number of activities on Lake Victoria, Africa's largest lake; and visiting the Namugongo Martyrs Shrines, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Don't miss the opportunity to visit the nearby Mburu National Park to catch a glimpse of local wildlife including hippo, zebra, gazelles, crocodiles, warthog, and variety of birdlife.

### **Jinja – Day 4**

Early morning after breakfast you shall check out and drive to Jinja a Prime Uganda tour-safari destination through Lugazi a favorite place of rest and healing for the Kabakas of the Buganda Kingdom, people who believe in kiganda traditions still come to seek the old ways at this place. For any visitor, these falls will leave a memorable adventure on your heart.

On your way **as you approach Mabira Forest.**

On top of the lovely over 312 tree and plant species, the forest has over 300 species of birds and over 218 of butterflies. Never-the-less, you shall find different types of monkey and other mammals in this Forest. Walking underneath this canopy of an African tropical Rain forest. Have a light lunch at Sunset Hotel - a lovely restaurant perched on a hill over the Nile. It serves all meal types, vegetarian included.

**You will later take a short ride to the source of the Nile** - a quiet beautiful place, filled with palm trees, fantastic tropical plants and as you walk down the steps toward the Nile you can smell of the flowers there. Have a boat ride and or opt for white water rafting. You can also bungee jump.

As you stand on the Nile, you will hear the gurgling water, watch native fishermen throw their nets in the longest river in Africa- **You will take a Boat Ride to the actual source of the Nile** and beyond the lake where you will take great pictures for future memories.

Transfer to your hotel before sunset for check-in and overnight stay at **Source of the Nile Hotel Jinja.**

Situated on the northern shores of Africa's largest lake, in southern Uganda, Jinja is the second largest city in Uganda and is famous for being located at the source of the Nile. The rapids on the Nile make Jinja the white-water rafting capital of East Africa. It is also known as the adventure capital of Uganda. While the main attraction is undoubtedly rafting down the Nile, there are also a variety of other adrenaline filled activities such as: quad biking, bungee jumping, kayaking, mountain biking and horse riding. Other popular activities include browsing the colorful Jinja market, viewing the faded grandeur of the crumbling colonial architecture lining the streets and joining a bicycle tour to soak up the spectacularly scenic surrounds.

### **Soroti – Day 5**

Have a leisurely breakfast at the hotel then check out.  
Depart for Soroti. Arrive and check-in at your hotel. (drive time is 4 hours)  
Discover the town as there are no activities to do here.

Overnight stay at **Soroti Hotel.**

### **Soroti – Day 6**

Day at leisure on bed and breakfast basis.

### **Day 7 – End of Itinerary**

Breakfast at the hotel and proceed to check out at about 07h00.

Depart for **Entebbe**. this will take 7 hours.

Arrive, bid farewell to your driver-guide and proceed to check-in for your outbound flight.

Located in the Soroti District in eastern Uganda, the little town of Soroti serves as the main commercial and administrative center of the region. Soroti provides an excellent base and convenient stopover for visitors wanting to explore Uganda's eastern region. It is known for its towering rocky outcrop overlooking the city, which offers scenic panoramic views of the area. Renowned for its history, the ageing buildings around town give a glimpse into Soroti's rich historical past. Soroti was home to a large Indian population and today visitors can view ornate Hindu temples, mosques, and Sikh gurdwaras scattered between local clothing shops, butcheries, and restaurants. Visitors can hike through the nearby Buganda and Opera Hills; explore the fishing villages around Lake Kyoga, which also offers a variety of thrilling water sports.
